SLSU Unified, Proactive and Progressive Response Extension Support Services (SUPPRESS) COVID-19 Initiatives

#### II. PROJECT CATEGORY

Manufacture of non-medicine products listed in Annex B of GPPB Resolution No. 3-2020 Production and distribution of PPEs

#### III. RATIONALE

The Southern Leyte State University has availed the grant of assistance to State Universities and Colleges in the country to combat COVID-19 as embodied in CMO No. 1, s. 2020. As stated in paragraph 3 under the Objectives stated in this CMO, "State Universities and Colleges are authorized by law/charter to conduct research and extension services, including projects that will improve and intensify the government's existing COVID-19 responses. In the report of the President to the Congress on 30 March 2020, the President had identified the efforts undertaken by CHED such as mobilizing HEIs to assist in the production and distribution of items (such as disinfectants, alcohol, face shields, etc.,) for use by frontline service providers. The Commission on Higher Education hereby issues the Guidelines in response to this national emergency by allocating/utilizing its funds towards mitigating the social, economic and financial impact of COVID-19 on Filipinos".

In this project, the intended beneficiaries are the SLSU students and employees, and their families, students and employees of two other SUCs in the region namely Visayas State University (VSU) and Leyte Normal University (LNU). The PPEs to be produced in this project serve as support to the frontliners of the SLSU and the two other SUC-beneficiaries.

#### IV. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The SUPPRESS COVID-19 Initiatives is an extension project of SLSU which is funded by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) classified as manufacture of non-medicine products listed in Annex B of GPPB Resolution No. 3-2020 and production

and distribution of PPEs. This will be implemented by the office of the Executive Operations and External Affairs under the Extension and Services offices of the whole university.

### V. OBJECTIVES

The SUPPRESS COVID-19 Initiatives Projects aims to produce PPEs specifically face masks, face shields and liquid hand soap and distribute them to the SLSU students and employees with their families and the students and employees of VSU and LNU.

- **Lot 1 ₽4,336,555.12** (Labor & Materials)
  - 160,000 face masks packed according to the specified number of pieces
- ➤ Lot 2 ₽1,869,415.80 (Labor & Materials)
  - 64,680 face shields
- **Lot 3 ₽709,811.10** (Materials only)
  - 18,250 liters of liquid hand soap contained in 1L and 500ml bottles.

6. Use all reasonable endeavors to provide the desired product based on specifications and timeframe.

#### XI. MONITORING AND QUALITY CONTROL

The supplier shall provide Production Plan to the Project Team which should indicate the agreed period of production and quality and quantity of products to be produced. The quality of materials to be used in the production must have been met as stipulated herein. A focal person is assigned check and monitor the production of each PPE. The first few number of items to be produced shall be checked first if they conform to the design and quality as stipulated in this term of reference before the mass production. Then weekly monitoring of the production status (quality and quantity as targeted) will be done. The Focal Person has the right to comment and give recommendations while the production is going on. The supplier shall cooperate and consider the recommendations to ensure that the PPEs are produced as agreed in terms of quality, quantity and production period.










# Design of the Face Shield




Top View
